



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fourth day of June 1734 Surveyed unto John Snider a tract of Land Situate near Oley in the County of Philada. Beginning at a post thence by Vacant land North Seventy degrees East Two hundred perches to a Large Chesnut-Oak thence by Vacant land North twenty Degrees West Eighty five perches to a post thence by Vacant land South Seventy degrees West Two hundred perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by Vacant Land South Twenty degrees East Eighty five perches to the place of Beginning Containing One hundred acres with the usual allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent. — Surveyed December 18th 1734
