By virtue of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries bearing Date the seventeenth Day of January Anno Dom. 1737 I have Surveyd and Laid out unto Edward Shippen in the Township of Hopewell in Lancaster County on the west side Susquehanna River: Nine hundred and Eight acres with allowance of Six & Cent. Beginning at a Hickory in the line of John Reynolds Land Thence by the Sd. Land North Twenty three Degrees Westerly Ninety six Acres to a Hickory Thence South Sixty Seven Degrees Westerly Two hundred and forty Eight Acres to a post Thence North Eighteen Degrees Westerly Ninety perches to a White Oak Thence North forty Degrees Easterly forty three perches to an Ash Thence ^{north} twenty Degrees Westerly one hundred & two perches to a Post Thence North Sixty Seven Degrees Easterly Two hundred and Eighteen perches to a white ^{oak} Thence North Fifty Degrees Easterly Three hundred and Twelve Acres to a Hickory Thence South forty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and Eighty Acres to a Hickory Thence South forty Nine Degrees Westerly four hundred and twenty perches to the place of Beginning.
