 by the sd Edward Smout's Land East 394 perches to a

 then down by the said 94 perches to the Beginning Con-
 taining 200 acres and allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ Ct. for Roads &c
 Surveyed $\frac{1}{2}$ Sa. Blunston Dep. Sur. $\frac{1}{2}$
