


By VIRTUE of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 4th Day of April Anno Dom 1737 the above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed unto Andrew Lycan in the Township of Hanover in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Black Oak Thence North 63 Degrees West by Land Claim'd by Lazarus Steward 247 per^s to a White Oak Thence North 27 Degrees East by Vacant Land 157 per^s to a Black Oak Thence East by Vacant Land 128 perches to a Chesnut Oak Thence down Indian Town Creek on the Several Courses thereof 260 perches to Swatawro Creek Then Down the same 80 perches to a post Thence South 41 Degrees West by Vacant Land 90 perches to the place of Beginning Containing Three Hundred and Nineteen Acres beside the allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads.
