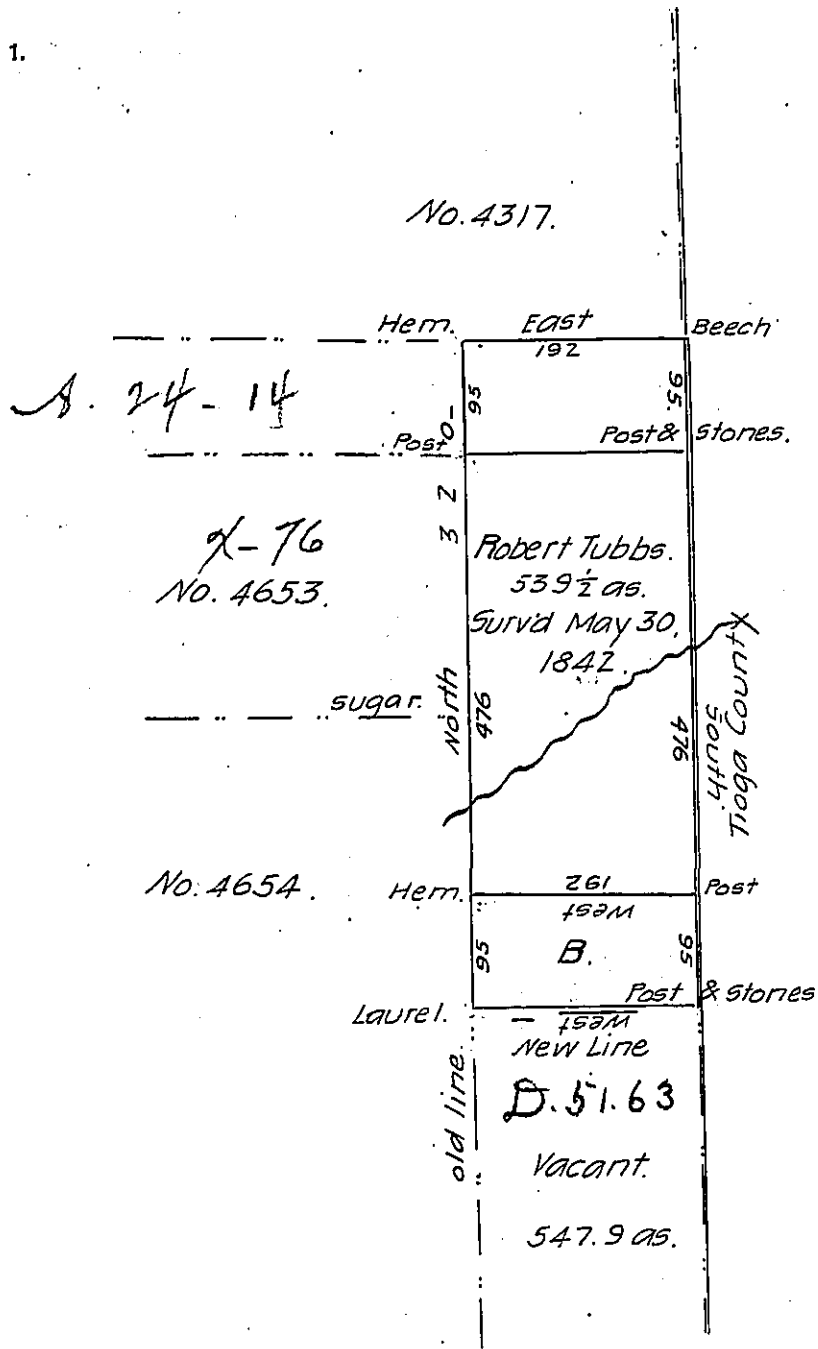

Robt Tubbs claims to have this Warrant bounded North on the line of No. 4317 as originally intended by him. The survey is made so that the number of acres are the same from the hemlock at the North in the line of 4317, to the hemlock South in the line of 4654, or from the post at the North to the Laurel at the South by the red line.

It would appear from the above that there has been an interference in the survey of No 3069 May 2d 1842 from the fact that the distance from the hemlock in the line of No. 4317 to the sugar is but 320 rods the distance required for No. 4653. The beech the North West corner of 4653 is noted by Mr. Dear—who resurveyed 4316 in 1840 as being in the line of that Warrant (4316).

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February 1833, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this third day of April 1907
