

21st May 1751, Judgment Given that George Churchman Make a Return of forty Acres and of 68^{as} as they have been Survey'd by him for James Petterson in London = Derry Township Chester County and notwithstanding John Calvins Caveat or his widdows Caveat, that the Surv^r Gen^l Accept the said Returns and Certifie the land Unto the Secretories office

and George Churchman his Deputy ~ This is Your Hon^{es} Judgmt

I do hereby Certifie and give from Under My hand unto James Petterson and That upon the Evidence of what John Ree told Me concerning a private contract or bargin Made betwixt Jn^o Calvin Now Deceas'd and And^w M^e Dowell about a piece of Land Lying and being betwixt said Calvins and petersons line, which land s^d peterson has survey'd out to him, and the s^d Jn^o Ree told me that Jn^o Calvin was to give And^w M^e Dowell twenty or twenty odd Acres of his land Joyning to Robert Dunns place and And^w M^e Dowell was to take s^d pettersons land from him, and give it to s^d Calvin in Liew of s^d land above Mentioned, and the one was to pay for the warrant, and the other was to pay for the surveying of s^d pettersons land, these words. I am willing to take my Solemn Declaration off, likewise the s^d Ree told me he was Eye wittness and Ear wittness to s^d Bargin, given Under My hand this 18th day of July 1750

will look into Such Dealings ~
