



Pursuant to a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 7th. day of November Anno. Dom. 1755 Granted. to George Ashbridge for the Surveying of 64⁹. of Land in any part of the Province of Pennsylvania not appropriated and Purchased of the Indians: The above Described Tract of Land (as part of the said Sixty four acres) was surveyed the 13th. day of the 3rd. mo. 1771. Which according to the Present Position of the Needle is bounded as follows (Viz). Beginning at a stone at a Corner of John Cloyds Land in a line of Joseph Lewis's Land Thence Extending by the said Land of the said John Cloyd South $87\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. 108° to a stake Thence by the same Land North 65° East 60 pches. to a stake Thence by Vacant Land North 16° West $8\frac{1}{2}$ pches. to a heap of stones in another line of Joseph Lewis's Land Thence by the same $576\frac{1}{2}$ West $16\frac{4}{4}$ pches. to the Place of beginning Situate in the Township of Tredyffrin in Chester county Containing $11^{\frac{9}{16}}$ P. & the allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent.
