Pennington Surveyor Generall to me directed bearing date the
 16th of the 10th month 1701. I Resurveid to John Burdale five hun-
 dred Acres of (obliterated) ate in ye fork of Brandewine Creek in the County of
 Chester Begining at a white oak in the Line of Thomas Buffingtons Land thence
 north 24 deg. west 400 perches to a white oak thence in ye Line of Daniel
 Smyth south 66 deg. west 200 perches to a Hickory thence south 24^{deg}.
 east 400 perches to a post thence north 66 deg. east 200 perches to the
 first mentioned white oak.
