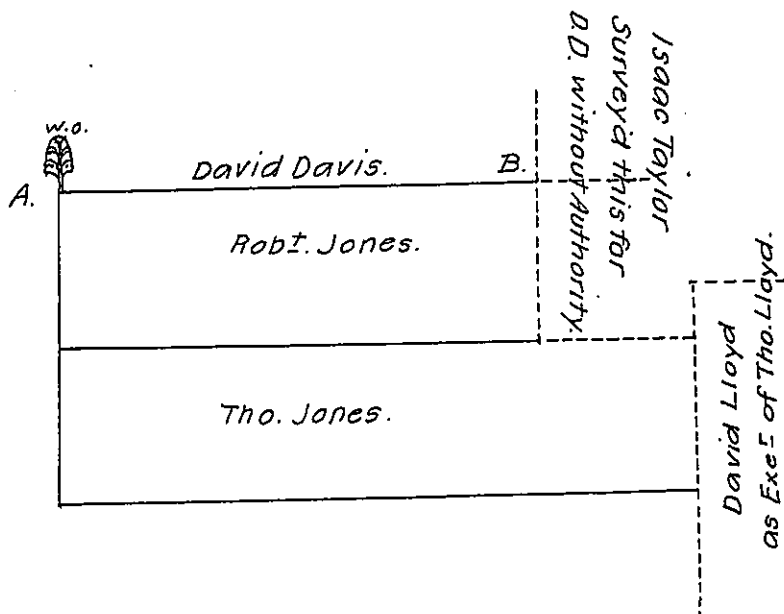


Late Edward Jones's land

A copy of D. Llewelyn's Description of R. Jones Land in Goshen. Survey'd at ye Request of Robt Jones a piece of Land of ye ensuing Dimensions Begin^d at a Corner marked w.o. thence N. 24. W. by D. Davis's Land 404 p. to a Stump of a B.O. thence N. 66. E. by other Lands of s^d D.D. (so called but as I am informed he has no Grant of it) 130 p. to a post thence S. 24. E. by T. Jones's part 404 to a heap of Stones on ye East Side of Chester Creek thence S. 66 W. by a Line Divid^d from ye Land now in Tenure of Tho. David 130 to the Beginning Contain^d 326 Acres.

Goshen 24th. 2^d m^o. 1721.

This due is 306 1/4 R. & Allowance 30.96, A Society Right of 100^A. Robt. Jones's patent extends to D. Lloyd's Land tho ye Dist. menjoned in ye patent will not reach it therefore R.J. desires his Society right may be laid on ye s^d Land (so survey'd for D.D.). he first having his Quantity with ye Allowance of 10 p. Cent w^{ch} Isaac Taylor has not left him James Logan not having granted to D.D. any Land save what ye Line A B. extend^d will include
