I viewd the Land above laid down according to your directions and think Jacob may have 50 perches in breadth laid to his line in which he takes in a good deal of indifference Land which woud be left out if Bumberger were allowd. y<sup>e</sup> first Survey You will observe That it is not Carryd out to Jacobs Corner by 46 p. The Reason is That Jacob has sold to Geo. Kline a strip off y<sup>e</sup> End of his Tract which reduces his Corner to y<sup>e</sup> Post markd G. Klines Corner As you Survey'd y<sup>e</sup> Tract if there should be any Variation in y<sup>e</sup> Course You can lay it down According to your Notes Square off from y<sup>e</sup> Line as above. I have Returnd a Draught of a Tract adjoining John Kingry which William Boyd took out a Warr<sup>t</sup> for dated 9<sup>th</sup> April 1741. - He sold his Right to Fredrick Onsolt who sold to Jacob Hovar and he has sold to J<sup>n</sup> Kingry who intends to take out a Patent, if their Releases are not formal Perhaps it will be y<sup>e</sup> least trouble to vacate y<sup>e</sup> old Warr<sup>t</sup> & issue a New one in J. Kingry's Name & Receive y<sup>e</sup> Return which I have left Blank & Request you to fill up as y<sup>e</sup> thing shall be Concluded upon - I am just Removing into my New House & Propose Setting off for Phil<sup>a</sup> next Monday
