as appears from a rough draft in the Deputy Surveyors office of Franklin County Certified the 15<sup>th</sup> of March 1830 in pursuance of a Contract with the Board of Property for the purpose of carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to Proprietary rights &c.
