Whereas the Propriet<sup>r</sup> by Deeds dated ye 21<sup>st</sup> & 22<sup>d</sup> of Dec<sup>br</sup> 1681. Granted to Gilbert Mace Citizen of London five hundred Acres of Land in this Province, Whereof the said Gilbert Granted one Moiety to John Marlow who sold the Same to Elizabeth Pace, who being now possessd of the said Right Requests by her Attorney our Ord<sup>r</sup> to take up the Same, These therefore are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be Survey'd to the S<sup>d</sup> Elizabeth Pace according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said moiety or Two hundred and fifty Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Seated by the Indians, and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office, Given under our hands and ye Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> ye 12<sup>th</sup> day of the first Month 171<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub>
