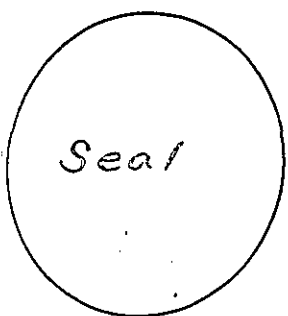


Pensilvania

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Governour in
Chief of y^e Province of Pensilvania and Countys Annexed

Whereas there is a Controversy depending between Jm^o Eastbourn on
the one part and John Nailor on the other concerning the overplus
of a certain Tract of Land Situate in Southampton Township in the
County of Bucks by me granted to Robt Marsh for 500 Acres.

200 of w^{ch} the S^d Nailour bought and the S^d Eastbourn the Remainder
for the final Determination thereof At the Request of the S^d John East-
bourn These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to be
resurveyd the whole Said Tract of 500 Acres according to the first
bounds and outlines of Survey and to run a Division Line through
the Same cutting off to the Said Eastbourn three fifths of the whole
Tract on that Side on which he is Seated the proportionable Overplus
of both Tracts to be purchased of me after thou shalt make Returns
of this into my Secretaries office w^{ch} thou art hereby required to doe wth all
convenient Speed. Given at Philad^{ia} 29. 1^{mo}. 1701
