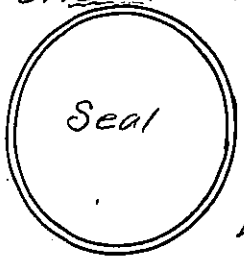


Pennsylvania S.S. By the Commissioners of Property.



Whereas the Propriet^r at his last Departure from this Province Granted unto David Powel of Philadelphia Survey^r: one Thousand Acres of Land to be taken up in the sd Province at the Rate or price of ten pounds p Hundred and the usual yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for ~~Every~~ ^{every} Hundred Acres, Two Hundred of the Said Thousand Acres being already laid out to the Said David Powel the Remaining Eight Hundred Acres He now craves may be alsoe laid out to him, These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out ^{or} cause to be Surveyd and laid out unto the Said David Powel according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said Quantity of Eight Hundred Acres of Land in the Said Province that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by Indians and make a Returne thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation, Given under our hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 28th day of the Sixth Month Anno D^m 1714
