Upon an agreement made with David Powel of Philadelphia Surveyor for three Thousand Acres of Land to be taken up in Six or less parcels back in the Said Province for which he is to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> Use Three Hundred pounds Money of this Province for the whole in manner following (Viz) One hundred pounds part thereof at the Survey now immediately to be made; One hundred pounds more on the first day of the first month next ensuing and the other hundred pounds on the first day of September next Ensuing the date hereof, and the yearly quitrent of One Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres thereof. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the Said David Powel according to the Method of Townships appointed amongst the late Surveys made back in the Said Province and in Six or less parcels the Said quantity of Three Thousand acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Which Survey ~~and~~ in case the Said David Powel fulfill & perform the above agreement according to the terms <sup>of time</sup> above mentioned shall be valid otherwise the same is to be utterly null and void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted, Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 10<sup>th</sup> day of 7<sup>br</sup> Anno Din 1717.
