that we would Grant him to take up Three hundred & eighty Six acres  
of Land ye Remainder untaken up of Seven hundred & fifty acres the  
Original purchasers of John Burchal and John Songhurst and also  
one hundred & Sixty acres the remainder of two Thousand five  
hundred Acres purchased of ye Proprietary by John Barber  
Since Deed, The Right to which Remainders (being together five  
hundred & forty six acres) being <sup>by</sup> Sundry Mesne Conveyances now  
Vested in the Said Samuel Powel, These are to Authorize and Require  
the to Survey <sup>or cause</sup> ~~or to~~ cause to be Survey'd unto the Samuel Powel the Said  
quantity of five hundred & forty six Acres of Land according to the  
Method of Townships and that has not been here to fore Survey'd  
nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns  
thereof into the Secretary's Office in order for a further Confirmation,  
Given under our hands & ye Seal of ye Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 30<sup>th</sup>  
day of ye first Month A.D. 1721.
