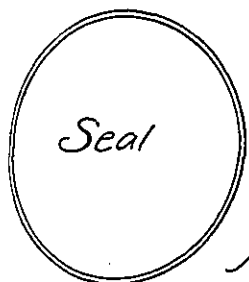


Pennsylvania S.S.

By the Commissioners of Property



At the Request of Samuel Pawel of Philadelphia that we would Grant him to take up One Thousand Acres of Land within this Province being the Original purchase of John Coals of Catcut in Somersetshire in Great Britain made of the Proprietor by Deeds of Lease and Release dated ye ninth and tenth dayes of September 1681 Whose nearest Kinsman and heir William Woodland of Kent County in Maryland by like deeds dated ye 22nd & 23 dayes of October last past Granted & Convey'd the Same to the said Samuel Pawel These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Samuel Pawel in the Said Province according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity of one Thousand Acres of Land (excepting the proportion to be laid out in the Liberties) that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns there of into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation

Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 5th day of 9^{br} Anno Dⁱ in 1719.
