 Surveyor General to Phineas Pemberton directed bearing date the
 9th of the eighth month 1701 (by Vertue of a warrant from the—
 Proprietarie to the said Edward Pennington dated the 2^d day
 of the fourth month 1701.) authorizing him to Layout unto Randal
 Blackshaw five hundred acres of land being part of 1500 Acres
 bought by Richard Blackshaw of James Harrison purchaser of 5000 Acres.

I do hereby Certifie That by Vertue of a Warrant from the—
 Commissionsers of property to Jn^o Cutler directed, authorizing
 him to execute all warrants directed to the said Phineas Pemberton

The said Jn^o Cutler hath made Returns of the Survey of the said
 500 acres Surveyd to the said Randal Blackshaw the 30th day
 of the 3^d month 1702. Which being Examined and Revised in the
 General Surveyors Office is as followeth Viz -

The said Land Seituat in the Township of Soulberrie in the County
 of Bucks beginning at a post (by Land appointed for a Road)
 being at the Corner of Thomas Carus's Land thence extending
 by the said Carus's Land North east 320 Perch- to a post by a
 Great Maple tree by a runn from thence by Vacant Land North
 West 250 perches to a post and heap of Stones, thence by
 Vacant Land South West 320 perches to a post from thence
 South east two hundred and fifty perches to the place of
 beginning Containing five hundred acres as afores^d
