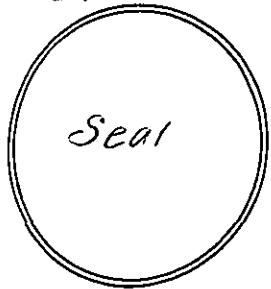


Pennsylvania S.S.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Jeffrey Burges of the County of Bucks that We would Grant him to take up two Hundred Acres of Land in the Mannor of Highlands in the Said County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Sixty pounds for the Whole & the usual yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto the Said Jeffrey Burges in that part of the Said Mannor on which the Land of y<sup>e</sup> London Company Joynes in a Regular Tract on the dividing line thereof the Said quantity of Two Hundred Acres of Land and make a Return <sup>of</sup> the Same into the Secretarys office, Which Survey in Case the Said Jeffrey Pay down at the Survey Twenty pounds and Twenty Pounds more at Philad<sup>a</sup> fair in y<sup>e</sup> next third Month and the Remaining Twenty pounds on y<sup>e</sup> 16<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> Ninth Month in y<sup>e</sup> year 1716 Shall be Valid atherwise the Same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted, Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 18<sup>th</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> Mo A.D. 1715.
