



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Commission to me directed bearing date the 11th day of the 6th month 1702. Resurveyed unto the heires of Stephen Beaks a Tract of Land at Quetyellassy in Soulbury Township in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Post by a black oak in Edward Hartley's line, Thence by the Said Hartleys and Paul Woolf's land N.W. 234. per.: to a Post by a White oak, Then N.E. by Samuel Beaks and vacant Land 427 per: to a Corner marked white oak. Then by William Groasdale and Randal Spikemans land S.E. 234. perches to a Post by three Poplars upon one Roote. Then S.W. by vacant 427 perches to the place of beginning Containing 624. acres and 78 perches.
