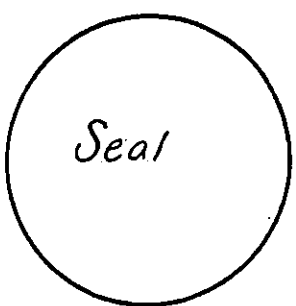


Pensilvania

At the Request of Nehemiah Allen, That we would Grant him to take up the Remainder of his father, Nathaniel Allen's Purchase of two thousand Acres That is yet untaken up, These are to require thee to Survey and lay out to the s<sup>d</sup> Nehemiah Allen according to the Method of Townships appointed, three hundred Acres of Land (in part thereof) that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Concealed nor Seated by the Indians, and make Returns thereof into the Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain & a Copy thereof to be deliv'd thee Attested by the Secretary. Given under our hand & the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 11<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1701.
