



Pursuant to a Warrant to me directed by Edward Pennington Surveyor General dated the 13th day of the 11th month — 1700 to Resurvey unto Andrew Elliot a certaine Tract of Land Lying in Makefield in the County of Bucks And Beging at Spanish Oak by the River Delaware, Thence by Henry Marjerums Lands South fifty three degrs West One hundred ninety Seven perches to a White Oak Then by the said Lands West by South Ninety eight perches & a half to a Red Oak. then West by the said Lands five hundred and ~~four~~ ^{four} perches to a Spanish Oak, then by Richard Houghs Lands North four degrs West Sixty five perches to a White Oak. Then by Thomas Kirles Land East one hundred ninety Seven and a half perches to a post, then by Peter Worrall & Richard Houghs Land East two degrs north three hundred fifty ~~eight~~ ^{two} prs and a half to a black. Then by said Houghs Land East thirty degrs north forty four perches to a White Oak. Then by said Houghs Lands East Thirty eight degrs north One hundred thirty five perches to a post. Then down the River by the Courses thereof South fifty degrs East

Seventeen perchs. Then South fifty Six degrs East Twenty eight perches. Then South fifty five degrs East Twenty Seven perches and a half to the place of Begining Containeing three hundred and Twenty acres and ninety three perches, Resurveyed and Certified the 11th day of the Second month 1701 P
