



In Pursuance of an Order from Jacob Taylor dated ye 3<sup>d</sup> day of the 10 month 1726 to mee directed to Survey to Thomas Edward One hundred Acres of Vacant land, Surveyed and layed out to Thomas this 13<sup>th</sup> day 10 month 1726 this Tract of Land, Beginning at a post the Corner of John James land, Thence Extending by the S<sup>d</sup> John James Land South East 56 perches to a heap of Stone, Than by Joseph Kirkbrides land North East 20 perches to a heap of Stone, Than by Vacant land North West 192 perches to a heap of Stone, Than by Vacant land South West 117 perches a post, Than by Thomas Edwards land South East 136 perches to a post, Than by John Jameses land North East 97 perches To the first Mentioned place of Beginning. Containing one hundred acres and six Acres added for allowance ~~of~~ Lyeing in ye Township of Hillton.
