



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Commissioners to me directed bearing date the 10th of the 1st month 170²/₂ and pursuant to a Warrt from Edward Penington Survey^r Gen^l to the said Phineas Pemberton dated the 18th of the 11th month 170⁹, Resurveyed unto Joseph Kirtle a Tract of Land in Bensalem in the County of Buck, Beginning at a black oak by Delaware River, being the Corner of Joseph Growth's Land. Thence by the Said Land N.N.W. 658. per: to a Post by Poetquessink Creek. Then E.N.E. by Joseph Growth's great Tract 100: per: to a Small Hickery marked for a Corner. Then by Nehemiah Allen's Land S.S.E. 637. per: to a Spanish Oak by the Said River, Then down the Same S. 75 Deg^s W. 33. per. Then S. 48 Deg^s W 72. p: to the place of Beginning, Containing 401^{ac} 1^r 24^p. Resurveyed the 23 of the first month 170²/₂.
