 Grant him to take up One hundred Acres of ^{Vacant} Land or thereabouts Situate
 between ye Lotts of Newtown and ye ends of Delaware River Lotts for
 Which he hath agreed to pay forty pounds on or before the first day of ye Sixth
 month next. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey to ye s^d Thomas
 the said quantity of One hundred Acres or thereabouts in ye place afore-
 said where Vacant & not yet taken up nor is Conceald nor Seated by ye
 Indians and make returns into ye Gen^l Surveyors Office at Philad^a
 Where this Warrt is to remain and a Copy thereof to be Deliv^d to thee
 Certified by ye Secretary w^{ch} Survey to be by thee made as afores^d.
 in case ye s^d Thomas Ashton shall fulfill ye agreem^t afores^d be
 Valid otherwise ye ^{shall} same to be Void and of no other Effect than if
 ye same had never been made, nor this Warrt Ever granted.
