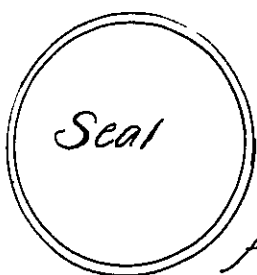


Pennsylvania S.S.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Caleb Pusey of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up One hundred and fifty Acres of Land in this Province in Right of John Cowgill, Edw<sup>d</sup> Mayos and William Smith who came Servants into this Province and have sold their Several Rights to the Said Caleb Pusey. Who also requests That we would Consider Some former Services by him done for the Propriet<sup>r</sup> particularly in Executing a Commission of Inquiry about Rights and Titles to Land in the Said County in the Year 1700 for which We have allowed him fifty acres & that the Said 150 Acres shall also be Granted to him free and upon the usual Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling p Hundred Acres. These are therefore to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Caleb Pusey According to the Method of Townships appointed the quantity of Two Hundred Acres of Land that has <sup>not</sup> been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Returne thereof into the Secretary's Office to be held by him and his Heirs on the Said Quitrent forever, Given under hands and Seale of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup>
