

Survey'd the 19<sup>th</sup> of October Anno 1717 by a warrant from the Commissioners of Property Dated the 27<sup>th</sup> of Septem<sup>r</sup> 1717 unto Hans Moyer a Certain Tract or Parcel of Land on Conestogoe Creek in the County of Chester Beginning at a post at a Corner of Melker Penermans Land and Running by John Fasers Land North by West two hundred Seventy two perches to a Chestnut tree by the said Conestogoe Creek Then down the same on sev<sup>r</sup>al Courses nine hundred and sixty perches to an Ash tree then South by East one hundred and ninety ~~perches~~ perches to a post ~~Then~~ Then by the said Melker Penerman's Land East North East ~~two hundred and~~ two hundred and thirty ~~perches~~ perches to the Beginning Containing three hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance.
