

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 27th day of the 10th Month 1715. I have Survey'd and Laid out to Harman Groethousen five hundred acres of Land in the Manor of Springfield in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a Post in a Line of Germantown Land and at a Corner of William Harmer's Land. Thence North East by the said Harmer's Land Eighty nine perches to a Great Corner Poplar. Then by the said Harmer's Land North West One hundred and thirteen perches to a hickory tree. Then North East by the said Harmer's Land One hundred fifty six perches to a black oak. Then by the said Manor North West one hundred eighty six perches to a post. Then by another Tract of William Harmer's Land South West two hundred forty five perches to a post. Then by the said Germantown line South East three hundred ninety nine perches to the place of Beginning. Survey'd the second day of May 1726.

Returned into the Secretary's Office June the 11th 1726.
