John Evan the Said two hundred Acres of Land Scituate as aforesaid and make Returns thereof into the General Surveyor's Office at Philadelphia where this Warr^t. is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delv'd to thee attested by the Secretary who is also to take a Duplicate of thy Return into his Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 18th of the 12th Mo 1701.
