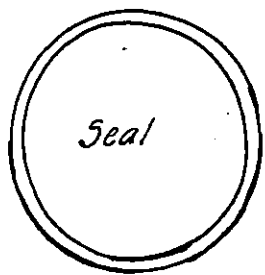


By the Commission: impower'd to grant Lotts & Lands in the Province of Pennsilvania & y<sup>e</sup> Territories thereunto belonging
