

Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 14th of 10^{br} 1702 there was Resurvey'd and Cut off for Richard Snead a piece of Land Containing five hundred and twenty four acres out of a Tract of Land formerly laid out to him by mistake within the Bounds of the Welch and ^{an} Settlements made therein. The Said piece of Land as now resurvey'd Beginning at a Stake at a Corner of Rowld Ellis his land Thence by the Same and the Land of Griffith Owen west south west three hundred & four perches to a post. Then by the Said Griffith Owens Land and John Finchers Land South south east two hundred Seventy six perches to a Hickery marked at a Corner of the Said Finchers Land Thence East north east three hundred and four perches to a post near a Marked black Oak Thence north north west two hundred Seventy Six perches to the beginning

Resurvey'd the 30th of the 5^{mo} 1702 unto Richard Snead of Bristol ment a tract of Land On the East side of Schuylkil—in the County of Philadelphia—beginning at a Dogwood tree marked by the said Schuylkil—Thence by the reputed Land of Charles Jones East north east 589 perches to a marked Chestnut Oak in the Line of the German Township Then by the said Line south east by South 94 perches to a spruce tree at a Corner of Charles Harfords land Then by the same west south west 576 perches to a Stake by the said Schuylkil River Then up the Same North 40 degrees westerly 96 perches to the place of ~~the~~ Beginning Containing three hundred and thirty four Acres
