



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Richard Carter an Inhabitant at Comestogo that we would grant him to take up two hundred acres of Land on or near Comestogo Creek for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Twenty pounds Money of Pensilvania for the whole and the Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Richard Carter at the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two hundred acres of Land that has ~~has~~ not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office. Which Survey in case the said Richard fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
