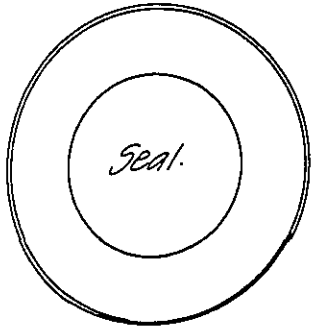


Pennsylvania *fo.*By the Commission^{rs} of Property.

At the Request of Thomas Chandler of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up a certain Tract of Land lying on Brandywine Creek formerly laid out to Israel Helme Jun^r for 174 Acres but afterwards was by him thrown up and deserted for fifty Acres of which he has agreed to pay to ye Propriet^{rs} Use twelve pounds ten shillings within three months after the date hereof and half a bushel of wheat yearly forever & for ye remaind^t the yearly Rent of three bushels of wheat forever: These are to authorize thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd to the s^d Thomas Chandler the afores^d Tract of Land according to the Ancient Bound^s by which it was at first laid out & make returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Which Survey in case the s^d Thomas shall Comply with the said Agreem^t shall be valid Otherwise shall be void & of no effect as if ye same had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & Seal of the s^d Province at Philad^{ia} the 8th day of the first month in ye 8th year of ye Reign of Queen Anne over Great Britain &c. Annoq. Dom 170⁸/₉
