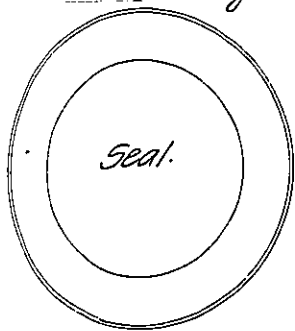


*Pensilvania* *fp.*

By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of Elizabeth Clayton wife of William Clayton of Chichester that we would grant her to take up fifty acres of land in this Province she haveing made it appear to us that she came into this Province with the first Adventurers a Servant to John Bezer and therefore desires she may have her Head Land according to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> Concessions. These are to authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Eliz<sup>th</sup> Clayton according to the Method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of fifty acres of land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Returne thereof into the Secretary's Office in order to a further Confirmation. Given under our Hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia ye 30<sup>th</sup> day of y 9<sup>th</sup> Mo. 1714
