

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property bearing date the 24<sup>th</sup> of the 6<sup>th</sup> month <sup>1703</sup> for surveying unto Joseph Brown Attorney to Susanna Cadman Six hundred and twenty five Acres of Land the Remainder and full right above what <sup>is</sup> already granted of Charles and Grace Bathurst their Original Purchase of twelve hundred and fifty Acres since purchased of the said Grace by the said Susanna Cadman. Surveyed and laid out the said Quantity of six hundred and twenty five Acres \* beginning at a <sup>White</sup> oak at the Corner of another tract of Land belonging to the said Susanna Cadman. Thence east by the line of the said - Cadman's Land two hundred twenty nine perches to a post thence north one hundred sixty three perches to a post thence east eighty six perches to a post then by John Worrall's land North two hundred perches to a corner. Chestnut tree then west three hundred and fifteen perches to a corner black oak Then south three hundred and sixty three perches to the place of beginning. Cont: 625 Acres.
