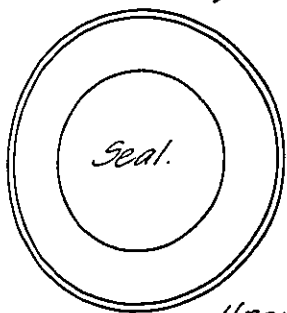


Pensilvania fe.

By the Commissioners of Property

*Upon a Conclusion now made with William Clayton of Chichester
on a former demand by him made of the Propriet^r in ^{or about} the year 1700 for part of
the land granted to the Swansons on the River Schuylkill in lieu of the ground
whereon part of the City of Philadelphia is built. These are to Authorize and Require
thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the said William Clayton among the
late Surveys made back in Chester County according to the Method of Townships
appointed the said quantity of five Hundred acres of Land that has not been
heretofore Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians (which said five
hundred ares are to be in full satisfaction of all demands whatsoever of him the
said William Clayton against the said Propriet^r.) and make returns thereof into
the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation. Given under our hands
and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 14th day of the Second Month Anno
Dni 1718*
