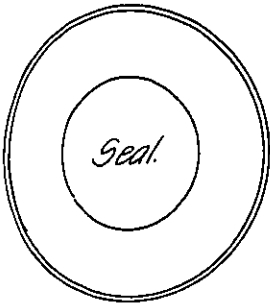


Pennsylvania fs.*By the Commissioners of Property.*

At the Request of Joseph Cloud of Concord in the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up five Hundred Acres of Land near Pequea Creek in the said County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors Use fifty Pounds many of Pennsylvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres thereof. These are to Authorize & Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto the said Joseph Cloud at or near the Place aforesaid the said quantity of five hundred acres of land according to the method of Townships appointed that hath not been heretofore Surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which survey in case the said Joseph fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16th day of the 3^d month Anno Dni 1717.
