


Pennsylvania.

By virtue of a warrant from y<sup>e</sup> Proprietary & Govern<sup>t</sup> bearing date the 21<sup>st</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> last, (directed to me) I hereby Certify into his Secretary's Office, y<sup>t</sup> I have caused to be Surveyed & set out the 30<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> M<sup>o</sup> then following unto James Delworth Purchaser, his City Lott in Philadelphia, situated between (obliterated) Street on y<sup>e</sup> North & high Street on y<sup>e</sup> South; Containing in breadth Twenty foot and in length Three hundred ninety six foot bounded Northward w<sup>th</sup> a vacant Lott Eastward w<sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> second Street from Skoolkill Southward w<sup>th</sup> Nicholas Walne's Lott Westward w<sup>th</sup> Skoolkill front Street; and is accordingly Entered & Recorded in my Office. Philadelphia this 9<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 5 M<sup>o</sup> 1684.
