

Respected Fr^d Mr^e Chapman:

Divers Persons as Adventurers having put Considerable sums of money into the Lottery all w^t falling vastly short of the quant^y expected the Proprietor was pleased to propose that those who had put in should have such Quantities of Land as their money would purchase at the Rate of 15" 10 P. Hund^d. &c. w^t they accept of. In pursuance of w^t divers Tracts have been lately laid out for them on & near the West Branch of Delaware River but not enough for them all.

I also made a Survey on one Tract about half way between Durham & Jurian Bess's upon the Run[&], thither on the Road, a Draught of w^t is hereto annexed the w^t I am since informd includes a Tract Surveyed by thee to ~~Mr~~ W^m Fry. I therefore desire thee to go to the place & to measure from some Corner of the Land thou Surveyed for Fry to some Corner of the Tract I surveyed & to make a draught thereof & send to me & therein to lay down the Survey made for ~~Mr~~ W^m Fry, the intention of all w^t is that ~~Mr~~ Fry may have that land if he desires it but I desire thee to say nothing of this to him or any other person.

I also further desire thee to lay out^a all the good Land on that Run whether above or below this Tract quite to Delaware yet untaken up (& no Surveys are made there if not by thee) & bring or send the Draughts thereof to me as soon as Convenience will allow the Charges of all w^t shall be fully paid (& pray spare not for necessaries) & thy kindness remembered whensover it may be in the power of thy fr^d to make other returns thereof
