



James Hendricks Land at Conestogo, beginning at the mouth of a Run by the ford over the sd Creek thence up the sd Creek traversing the several Courses thereof 950 perches to a white oak thence south by East by ye Land of Thomas Baldwin 115 perches to a black oak thence west south west by the Land of John Hendricks 176 perches to a Hickory thence South by East by the same Land 195 perches to a post thence west south west by the Land of David Priest 20 perches to a post thence Northwest 14 perches to a white oak by ye first mentioned Run thence down the same 231 perches to the place of Beginning - Containing 300 acres with the usual allowance of 6 per cent.
