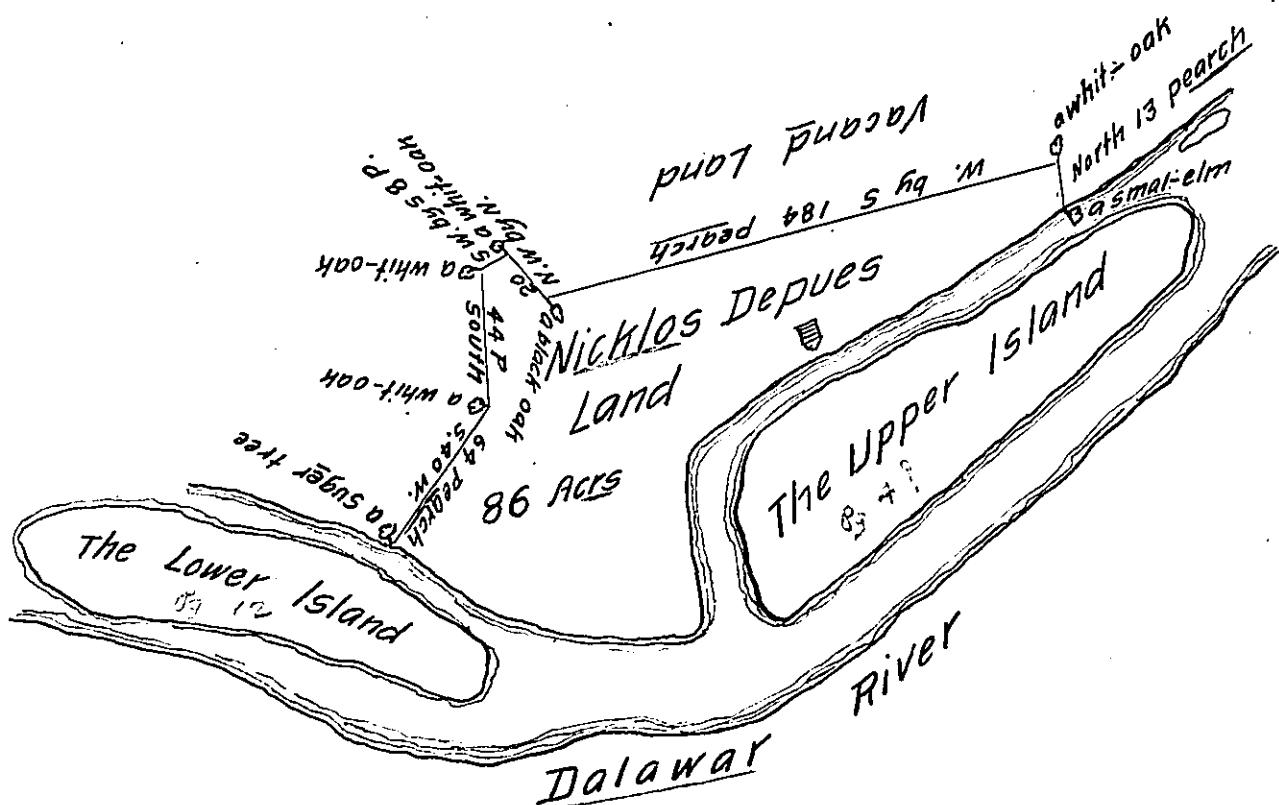

This Tract of land begineth at a small Elm standing by the side of the Dalawar-over against the upper Island then runeth north thirten perches to a whit-oak then west by south one hundred eighty fower perches to a black oak then norwest by north twenty perches to a whit-oak all by vacand Land then south west by south eight perches to a whit-oak then south forty fower perch to another whit-oak then south ^{degrees} forty west sixty fower perches to a suger tree standing by the sid- of Dalawar-over against the upper end of the Lower Island then upp by the sevrl courses of the River or inlett of the saim to the place of begining. Containing eighty six acres surveyed in the 3 month 1730
