The Allegheny is of a good quality and amounts to 20000 acres
 The Allegheny is a fine river, its navigation is somewhat obstructed
 by rapids in various places by the Allegheny Falls the total descent of which is two
 feet in one mile in a distance of ten miles. This river is about a hundred yards
 wide at the mouth of the Robinson branch. The Robinson branch is beautiful
 deep narrow and not obstructed by falls it is about one hundred yards wide at its
 junction with the Allegheny branch and gradually diminishes in width to the
 head in one hour where it is forty yards wide.

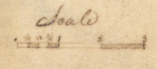
The Little Juniata is about forty yards wide at its junction with the Robinson
 branch and up as far as the mouth of Spruce creek and from thence to Belle Mills
 it is about thirty yards wide and is a beautiful clear steady stream and one of
 the best in the County for driving of Saws &c.

How creek is one hundred yards wide as far as Cowles mill Robinson branch
 widens to two hundred yards at its mouth and nearly that width up to the first
 dam from the falls and only narrows to a few rods. Great Allegheny creek is about forty
 yards wide as far as the mouth of Black log creek and about thirty from thence to the mouth
 of Spring Lake creek which creek might be made navigable for fifty or sixty miles it is the
 only one that is navigable for improving the navigation of four rivers of a small proportion of
 the way that is done by a few rapids and locks to make it navigable for a small part of
 the way. The rapids are from the mouth of the river to the falls and are the public concern
 of the State. The rapids are the Allegheny and Broad top the second step and the
 third are the Allegheny and Broad top. The perpendicular height of these rapids may be
 from five hundred to fifteen hundred feet above the level of the river.

There are numerous waterfalls in the Allegheny of which have been explained the largest
 and the most beautiful is at the mouth of the river and is well worth a visit.

The springs of the Allegheny and the water springs near Huntingdon and the
 Allegheny. The water springs in the Allegheny are in the Allegheny valley and are
 the Allegheny, Broad, Cheat, Salt and Allegheny. Marble
 and several townships are of various colors.
