my true and lawful Attorney, and do substitute him in my place and stead, with full
power and authority to ask, demand, and receive in my own name, and for my use
and benefit, all the Wages and arrearages of Cloathing ^{and Lands} due to ^{the said Michael Brannon deceased} from the Public ^{for or for the said}
^{for his} services in the Regiment aforesaid, and upon receiving a Certificate or Certificates
therefor from the Register of the Treasury, or other proper Officer, to sign in my name
a full acquittance of claim to the arrearages aforesaid; and do further invest him with
ample authority, as if I myself were personally present; a substitute or substitutes under
him for the aforesaid purposes to constitute and appoint. Hereby ratifying and confirming
all that my said attorney and substitute, or his substitute or substitutes shall or may do in

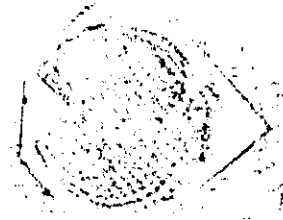
