

Know all Men That I John Busick, late a Soldier in the Pennsylvania line, now of the Northern Liberties of Philadelphia Labourer, have this eighth day of June Anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty seven received of Michael Andrews of the said Liberties the Sum of ten pounds Lawfull money, For and in Consideration whereof I have and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell assign release and confirm unto the said Michael Andrews his Heirs and Assigns all that Tract of Donation Land and Premises N<sup>o</sup> 1328 Situate, lying and being in the Third District in the County of Westmoreland in the State of Pennsylvania, containing Two hundred Acres and allowance for Roads granted and allowed to one or to which I am entitled for my Services for a Soldier aforesaid, Together with the appurtenances, And the Reversions and Remainders thereof And all my Estate, Right Title, Interest, Claim and Demand whatsoever in Law and Equity of in and to the same, To have and to hold the said Premises hereby granted or mentioned so to be with the appurtenances unto the said Michael Andrews his Heirs and Assigns To and for the only proper Use and behoof of the said Michael Andrews his Heirs and Assigns for ever.
