

 by Major ^{General} ~~Carson~~ ^{Carson} that the said Discharge was in the same terms as other
 Discharges given at the end of the war and was several times in the
 hands of this Department and not deposited to at the public office, but
 is since lost or misplaced. That when about settling the Accounts this
 Department ^{was informed} that David Davis had served in the Artillery from an
 early period of the war till he was taken prisoner, he believes at the
 Battle of ~~the Clouds~~ ^{Brandywine} in 1777 and that after his return having made
 his escape from the British he by General ~~Proctor~~ ^{Proctor} ~~was~~ ^{was} ~~sent~~ ^{sent} ~~out~~ ^{out} ~~his~~ ^{his}
 name at the said Laboratory sworn and subscribed before me
 this 29th day of October 1804 —
