 or the United States agreeably to the Laws in such
 Case made and Provided and sufficient Receipts or
 other acquittances to give for the same as though I
 were then personally present and as though his
 Powers were herein more particularly specified hereby
 Ratifying and confirming whatsoever my said attorney may or
 shall lawfully do in the premises and also imbruing him or
 more attorney under him to make and again to Revoke at his
 Pleasure in Writings whereof I the said David Davis have
 heretofore set my hand and offered on the 15th day of
 the month of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and four
