was to receive Compensation any sum whatever
by Power of Attorney to recollect that his said or
pay, as aforesaid - saw James W. Phelps, who has
this day returned to Court & Attorney without
to spare him for that purpose in the Year 1799

Oath and declaration this 14th day of July 1807
