Private Soldier in Captain John Steele's
Company, in the first Pennsylvania Regiment,
Commanded by Colonel Brattle,
during the late Revolutionary War, do
make, constitute and appoint George Duffield
Esquire, of the Borough of Lancaster, in the County
of Lancaster and State aforesaid, — my true
lawful Attorney for me and in my name
and for my Use, to ask, demand and by all

lawful Ways and Means to obtain from
the Persons duly authorized — a Patent or
Patents for the Donation Lands which my
said deceased Husband William Gordon
is entitled to, for the Service which he has
rendered to the United States or State of Penn-
sylvania, by Virtue of any Act of the said
United States or under the authority of the said
State of Pennsylvania, — with power also
an Attorney or Attorneys under him for that
purpose to make & substitute, and to do all
lawful Acts requisite for effecting the
Premises; hereby ratifying and confirming
all that my said Attorney or his substitutes
or substitutes shall do therein by virtue
hereof.
