will give good and firm Conveyances unto the said
Alexander Power for ~~the~~ all the Land he is
entitled to by Resolves of Congress and Acts of Assembly
of this State as ~~is~~ and that he will without
Delay pay or give unto the said Alexander Power
his heirs and Assigns such Certificate and Conveyances
if therefore the said Henry Henley should well
and truly perform all Matters and things herein
before mentioned or his heirs Executors or Admini-
strators without fraud or Deceit then the aforementioned
obligation to be void or else to remain in full force
and virtue
