a Musqueteer, in Capt. Montgomery's Company of the  
first Regiment of the Pennsylvania Line, Col. Butler,  
till he was discharged, his Discharge being left in  
the War-Office upon receiving his Certificate and one  
hundred Acres of Land from the Government of the  
United States of America.

Before me the Subscriber, one of the Judges,  
of the Court of Common Pleas & in and for the County  
of Lancaster, personally appeared Jacob Dickert, of the  
Borough of Lancaster, Gummitt, and of legal age, who  
made solemn Affirmation, That a certain Christopher Leveringhouse,  
who at the present time is employed by him in the Gun-  
smith Trade, is the same identical Person, whose name  
is entered in the List of the Continental Soldiers en-  
titled to Donation Lands; that he, said Christopher  
Leveringhouse, was in the Deponent's employ in the  
same trade at the time, when he was enlisted, & that  
he entered again into his service immediately after the  
War was ended, and after he was discharged, said  
Jacob Dickert further says, that he well recollects, that  
said Christopher Leveringhouse, or Leveringhouse,  
when re-employed by him, sold his Certificate to Jo-  
nah Lockhart for about Twenty Dollars, taking some  
Store-goods in payment. And further he says not.
